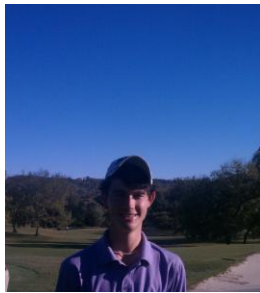

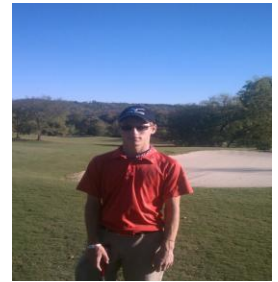

From the Superintendant

Thank you for all the members that have expressed their concerns and issues with what is going on at the golf course. Your statements and issues have been taken in consideration and will be addressed in a timely manor. It is my feeling that any question or concern brought to our attention is an opportunity for Nashville Golf & Athletic Club to better serve our membership. Open communication will aid in member satisfaction and will insure that items are addressed promptly. Please continue any correspondence.

I will be including, in the Newsletter, a short synopsis of what is going on in the up-coming month. If a anything needs to be addressed quicker than that, I will utilize the weekly e-mail that you are currently receiving.

On going Projects:

- Considerable greens repair work has been completed on holes #8, #9, #15, #16. Please refrain from walking on these areas and take appropriate relief when landing in them. Continued greens repair will be work in progress. Sorry for any inconvenience.
- Fairways and tees have been seeded, and are starting to germinate. These areas will not be mowed until the grass is strong enough to take a mowing. This year we reduced the amount of strawed tees considerably. Most tee complex's have only one strawed tee, and shady tees will not be over-seeded. This will give more teeing area to handle the winter traffic.
- Bunker sand will be added and moved to proper depth in bunker holes number 2,5,6,7,8,9,10,18. All bunkers will be monitored for depth, maintenance, and remodeling. Edging of all bunkers will also be on the docket.
- Cart path repair and edges where soil has erosion issues will be addressed, continued throughout the fall.
- Tree on #9 tee will be removed
- Stump removal and other tree work will be going on during these times

P.S. Frosty days are upon us. Please remember we will get you out as soon as we can when temps are low. We are in constant contact with the Golf Shoppe about frost delays, please refer to them before proceeding.

Rules Change Brief

Ball Moving After Address (Rule 18-2b). A new exception is added which exonerates the player from penalty if their ball moves after it has been addressed when it is known or virtually certain that they did not cause the ball to move. For example, if it is a gust of wind that moves the ball after it has been addressed, there is no penalty and the ball is played from its new position.

Time of Starting (Rule 6-3a). The rule is amended to provide that the penalty for starting late, but within five minutes of the starting time, is reduced from disqualification to loss of the first hole in match play or two strokes at the first hole in stroke play. Previously this penalty reduction could be introduced as a condition of competition.
